About the university:

The University of Navarra is a Catholic University founded in 1952 and recently has been ranked among the best by <u>"The Herald Tribune</u>" and ranked as the 4th best Spanish university in Europe according to the Times Higher Education QS University Ranking.

It has 4 Campuses, the <u>IESE</u> Business School in Madrid, Barcelona and New York, and the main campus in Pamplona, which has 17 Faculties and Schools (and including <u>University of Navarra Hospital</u> and the CIMA Medical Research Center), and the Technological Campus in San Sebastian, which hosts Tecnun and <u>CEIT</u>, an affiliated Research Centre.

Tecnun is ranked as the 1st private Spanish Engineering School and it is 3rd in global ranking, according to the Spanish ranking in "El Mundo".

TECNUN offers new degrees in the Bch/Ms model (4+1) according to the post-"Bolonia Agreement" that started at Tecnun in year 2009-2010.

Mentoring	Student mentoring is defined as a one-to-one relationship between a student and a lecturer.
